


## **WORKING-AGE POPULATION**

HIES 2019 estimates, the working-age population (aged 15+) as 317,482, with slightly over half (53 percent) are women.

HIES coverage is limited to households in administrative islands only. (excludes: tourist resorts, industrial islands, collective living quarters)






## WORKING-AGE POPULATION

With in the elderly population, more elderly people reside in Atolls.




## **EARNERS**

Out of the working age population (**15 years and above**) **70%** were income earners.

Earners also include those people not in employment but receives transfer incomes (eg: basic pension for the elderly).

### Average number of earners by locality






Average number of earners per household was **2.6** 

## **INCOME PER HOUSEHOLD**

HIES 2019 results shows that in Maldives, households earns on average MVR 28,746 per household on a monthly basis. The amount earned is nearly doubled in Male' compared to the **Atolls**. The average monthly household income in Male' was MVR 38,596, compared to MVR **19,633** in **Atolls**.

# Average monthly Income per household






Average house-hold income in Male' is nearly double compared to Atolls

## **INCOME PER PERSON**

The results also showed that a person earns MVR 5,538 per month on average at national level while average income of a person in Male' is **higher** than that of the national figure, at MVR 7,479. This is again substantially lower in the Atolls (MVR 3,762), where a person earns MVR 3,200 less than that of an individual in Male'.

## INCOME PER PERSON PER DAY

When we convert this to daily basis, a person earns MVR 182 per day at the national level.


A person in the Atolls earns

# MONTHLY INCOME PER PERSON BY QUINTILES

The household income distribution by per capita income quintiles shows that total household income varies a lot across quintiles both in Male' as well as in the Atolls. In case of Male' the poorest 20 percent of the total households earned only 1% of the total income compared to **58%** of the total income earned by the richest 20 percent indicating inequality within Male'. In Atolls, the share of income between different per capita quintiles is equally distributed among the mid three quintiles (top 40 percent to **80 percent**) with less share among the bottom 20 percent.



#### How quintiles are derived:

To derive the quintiles, households are sorted by per capita income from least to the highest. Then these figures are divided into five equal groups referred to as income quintiles. The lowest group is the first quintile holds 20 percent of the total population which contain the lowest values of the distribution are attributes to, the second group refers to the second quintile and so on. The fifth quintile or richest 20 percent refers to the top twenty percent of households.

There is a high degree of income inequality in the country, with only 5% share of income in the hands of poorest 20%

# POPULATION LIVING BELOW 50% OF MEDIUM INCOME

17% of the population lives below 50 per cent of the median income indicating the inequality in the income distribution within the country.

Inequality at Atolls is at 29% while it is at 5% in Male'.

Among different age groups, children are more likely to experience inequality and poverty in the country.



## INCOME DISTRIBUTION


Nearly 60% of population gets less than MVR 5,000 per person per month and less than 1% of population gets MVR 20,000 and above per person per month.

Comparison between Male' and Atolls shows cumulative distribution function for the Atoll is relatively steep than Male'. This means that people in the Atolls get less per capita income than those in the Male'. Almost 60% of the Atoll population gets less MVR 3,762 per person per month while only about 18% of the Male' population gets this amount. This shows that there is huge income disparity between Male' and in the Atolls.



## INCOME DISTRIBUTION


There is a large difference in income in Male' and the Atolls. The income distribution of Maldives in 2019 is right (positive) skewed since the bulk of the values are concentrated on the left of the figure.

The distribution of per capita income in Male' and in the Atolls. As seen from the figure, the distribution in Male' is shifted to the right, indicating higher income compare to Atolls. The distribution of Atolls shows majority of the population earns less income compared to Male'.

# Distribution of monthly per capita income, Male & Atolls 2019






The income distribution in Atolls shows majority of the population earns less income compared to Male'

## INCOME DISTRIBUTION

Even though the mean monthly total per capita income for Male' is almost 2 times higher than the Atolls across the per capita income deciles the distribution between Male' and Atolls is almost similar.

## **SOURCES OF INCOME**

More than half of the total household income (58%) came from wages & salaries in the atolls and nearly two third (67%) in Male'. The proportion of income from **business** was the second highest source of income for the atolls. However, in Male', property income from renting of buildings, land, machinery and equipment, and other types of property income, was the second highest source of income, contributing 14% of the total household income.

### **Distribution of Income by Sources**



The major source of income persisted to be wages and salaries for both Male' & Atolls.
